Keiki Photography Grades: K-5 Mr. Bob, Students will learn the basics of iPad photography as they develop a visual awareness of their surroundings

Capoeira, Grades K -8, Mr. Mario Hill, Capoeira is an Afro-Brazilian Art Form that combines martial arts, music, acrobatics, song and culture into a game that is played by its practitioners.

Fluid Art Grades: 4-5 Ms. Sharon, Students can have fun with this class as they create abstract paintings using the fluid painting technique. Afterward, they will write reflections of what they see in their art!

Ukulele Grades 3-8, Mr. Bob Teixeira, Children will learn about music, beat, harmony, melody, rhythm, and tempo. The ukulele helps children develop eye-hand coordination as well as independent movement of fingers.

Okinawan Style Taiko Drumming, Grades K-5, Lisa Hallett

We carry our drums, perform to music, shout & jump around. Students will also learn about the history & culture of Okinawa

Cooking and Culture, Grades 1 &2 and 3&4, Ms. Kitamura, learn about different cultures and the foods that they eat!

Learn to sew, Grades 4-5, Judy Howard, learn beginning safety sewing skills, why is sewing so handy and sew simple drawstring bags and other types of bags

After School Science investigations w/Matt Binder at the Middle School, Students will learn to think like a scientist and, in the process, discover that science is fascinating and fun! Mr. Binder will use his big bag of scientific tricks to help students answer all sorts of questions about science from astronomy to zoology, biology to chemistry, and geology to physics

Fun with Plants: Grades 3-5, Ms. Lisa Hallett: Kids will learn how to plant native and food plants organically. We will be learning about planting, preparing and cooking. Planting for eating, and other uses like Art. Children will be bringing home plants in pots. Boxes will be provided for transport.

Ballet/Jazz Dance, Grades K-5, Miss Minotti, Students will learn ballet terminology & movement while infusing their own style with today's modern jazz movement. Dancer will need a black leotard, pale pink tights, and pink canvas ballet shoes.

Coding, Grades 5-8, Erica Owens, Students will make projects that integrate textiles, circuits and coding. Some projects are paper circuits, a bracelet that lights up.

Line Dancing, All ages to Adults, at HONOKAA High School Auditorium, Pauline Dias, Children and Adults will have the opportunity to learn a western type of dance
